Certified instructors teach archery, black powder, pistol, rifle, shotgun and hunting in safe environments. The intent of the program is for members to complete activities in areas of interest in the beginner to senior levels of the program. Beginners learn the basics of archery and air rifle before moving on to more advanced equipment. Shooting sports activities have age level requirements (ages 8-18). Local competitions are held throughout the state for youth to demonstrate their knowledge and skill.

Ages 11-13

Expanding Horizons Advanced/Level 3

Ages 14-18

- Make a piece of traditional shooting sports equipment.
- Participate in a state match with a chance to attend the national event.

- Create a taxidermy mount or build a shooting bench.

Citizenship

- Volunteer to make a shooting sports presentation.
- Volunteer to help at local or state matches.

Leadership

- Lead and organize a club event for environmental improvement.
- Train as a junior leader in shooting sports.

 Start a taxidermy or custom-build shooting sports equipment business.
